RDCT SEMINARS – BENEFICIARIES' POINT OF VIEW

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Resource and Development Center for Transnistria, project implemented by Promo-Lex Association, financed by National Endowment for Democracy, organized, on March 9th, a seminar on „Human Rights – general aspects” at Cosnita village, it being part of a series of seminars of this kind.

People of different ages and professions from different settlements participated to the seminar. At the seminar were presented and discussed the basic principles of human rights, the bodies that protect human rights theoretically and practically.

Since the very first meetings of participants within these seminars, at which I also was present, could be observed a free exchange of opinions in regard to situation from Transnistria and some civic initiatives. There was also approached the difficulty and lack of alternative sources of information for population from the left bank of Nistru river that leaves in a censured informational environment.

The developed seminars proved the lack of knowledge in regard to „Human Rights”, some of participants not knowing whom to appeal and how to protect their rights.

On March 10th, RDCT Team organized another seminar on „NGO – general overview”. The seminar organized for a group of 20 persons, representatives of civil society from the left bank of Nistru river aimed at informing the participants in regard to basics of functioning of a NGO, requirements and general principles, structure and content of projects, building of practical abilities in writing and presentation of projects, building of team spirit among the seminar participants. In regard to practical part, the participants were divided into workshops to present project ideas, check on knowledge gained in project writing. At the end of the seminar, each group presented their own project, such as:

- ecology and environment;
- the right to information is your right;
- development of knowledge in democracy;

The seminar contributed to improvement of knowledge of young people from left bank of Nistru river in regard to NGO creation and administration and project writing. At the end of each seminar, the participants were filling out questionnaires in order to evaluate the seminars' results.

NGO IN DETAILS

EXPERIENCE: „EVERICA” PUBLIC ASSOCIATION

“Evrica” Public Association was registered in 2005, Rezina town mayoralty, at the initiative of a group of parents whose children study at “Evrica” Lyceum from Ribnita town.

Since its foundation, “Evrica” Association actively involved in activities that would facilitate and improve the situation of students, parents and teachers from the only lyceum that teaches in Latin scrip from the North of Transnistrian region (although there are many settlements where the population would like to study according to educational program of constitutional authorities).

Recently, the Association managed to implement its first project, which, we believe, was a success for us and civil society from both banks of Nistru river. This way, in June-October, “Evrica” participated, as partner, to a project coordinated by “Act-Civitas association from Chisinau financed by UNDP Moldova, and during November 2006 – March 2007 coordinated and implemented the project “A democracy for all”. This project was financed through “Contact” Center by DFID within the program “Creation of a peace framework in the Republic of Moldova”. The project idea was to create, through “TV Elita” Rezina town television, some bridges for information and, in the future, for collaboration for representatives of civil society from both bank of Nistru river.

During this period of time, there were performed and put on air 7 TV shows, one hour each, on different topics, both in Romanian and Russian languages. I must mention that the topics discussed were chosen in order to be interesting for most of population. For example, there were discussed topics like: Human Rights – general aspects, Civil Society and NGO, youth issues, mass migration and inter-ethnic relations on both banks.

Due to the fact that the topics discussed were actual and that the invited experts were competent, the shows had success, to which, the professional team of TV Elita television contributed very much as well. All the shows, except the first one, were live. The relevance of issues approached and interest of viewers was proved by their questions asked during the shows. It must be also mentioned the fact that the questions were asked both by viewers from Rezina raion (right bank of Nistru, under control of constitutional authorities) as well as from Ribnita town and raion (left

bank, under control of Smirnov regime).

The success of shows was also ensured by participation of some experts competent in different fields – Oazu Nantoi, Ion Manole, Serghei Ostaf, Stefan Uritu and other from the right bank of Nistru river and – Nicolai Buciatkii, Ion Iovcev, Oxana Fateeva and others from the left bank of Nistru river. The relevance and success of shows was also demonstrated by the fact that some shows, because of many questions, lasted more than one hour (time planned for each show).

This project was the first one implemented and coordinated by “Evricea” Association. Of course there were many difficulties and obstacles, but, unfortunately we must state that the most serious problem for us was to convince and ensure participation to shows of experts from settlements under control of Smirnov regime. This way, because of the situation from this region, many of those who we invited were refusing to participate because of possible persecutions. Even so, the issue can be overcome and, I believe, that civil society will understand the necessity to consolidate common capacities to peacefully solve the created situation. Coordinating this project, “Evricea” members obtained an important and very useful in the future experience. “Evricea” Association thanks all the participants to this series of shows and expresses its hope for a future collaboration for the good of society.

Participants to BTD scholarship “European leadership and political learning for motivated youth from the Republic of Moldova”, implemented by IDIS Viitorul

During March 12th-17th, in the frames of 5 pre-university institutions (Dorotcaia Lyceum, “Stefan cel Mare si Sfint” Lyceum Grigoriopol, “Mihai Eminescu” Lyceum Dubasari, “Ion Creanga” Lyceum Cosnita and Cocieri General School) from Dubasari raion took place the initiative “Civic Week in Dubasari” with the topic “I am a Volunteer, I bring Change”.

The goal of this initiative is to promote the concept of volunteering among young people from Transnistria through performance of Volunteer's Galery, which took place on March 17th of this year, at “Dorotcaia” Lyceum, Dubasari raion. During initiative implementation, the young people from IX-XII grades managed to achieve this goal through involvement with volunteering activities (at school, lyceum or community).

The youth's results are worth applauses, and even more a worth followed by other school students from other regions of the republic. The initiative group from

Dorotcaia Lyceum spent their time in different activities: tutoring in I-XII grades, book presentations, "Transnistria – my tear" instructive – educational activities, seminar on "Children's rights – who does not know, does not have them!", debates on "Youth can solve local problems", etc.

The initiative group from "V. Iovita" General School from Cocieri village performed: an ecological action for cleaning the schools park, as a result of which held a seminar on importance of protection of environment for school students from IV grade and finished with a seminar on "Children's Rights" to inform and promote these.

With the slogan "Our future is in our hands!", the initiative group from "Ion Creanga" Lyceum from Cosnita village planted, on the bank of Nistru river, trees (200) to prevent land sliding and to create a pleasant atmosphere for the community in which they live and activate. In order to obtain these trees, the students collected money and also appealed to the mayoralty with which managed to establish collaboration. In the future, the youth plans to place specialized waste containers for glass, paper and plastic to be recycled.

"Stefan cel Mare si Sfint" Lyceum from Grigoriopol, sheltered at Dorotcaia, identified volunteering as the "art to be beautiful". Their initiative group divided in two teams: first one went to the village river and performed an ecology action; and the other one performed a public debate on "Can youth solve problems at local level?" and an informational action "Pro Health". But, these schools students prove the will of a volunteer when they come to study to Dorotcaia to study every day!

The same will is proved by students from "Mihai Eminescu" Lyceum Dubasari, the headquarters of which is sheltered at Corjova village. Their initiative group spent their time with "those who are less fortunate" - old people from asylum for aged and children from socially vulnerable families. During several days, the students managed to collect a big number of clothes and money for food products for these aged people and children.

"It is not the end of our action", revealed the students at the Volunteers Galery on March 17th of this year, were was discussed the problems faced and solutions found, where students together with teachers evaluated their results and established certain starting points for the future. We, organizers, also continue to support them and their innovative ideas. We invite you as well not to stay cold towards our co-citizens, inhabitants of Transnistrian region.

ABOUT MOLDOVAN-TRANSNISTRIAN NGO FRIENDSHIP

„Too much noise about a thought, always makes it obscure...”

Stefan Zweig

Upon reading the title of this article, many who somehow have something to do with the third sector, will smile – at minimum, will laugh – at maximum. You do not have to be a fortune teller to be confident in such a reaction.

Why is it so? As I understand, “officially” everything is just fine. The Transnistrian organizations associate with Moldovan ones, write common projects, sometimes even implement them. Representatives of Transnistrian NGOs are often guests in Chisinau, Moldovan representatives also, (if they wish so of course) visit their Eastern neighbors. Then then, in private, the discussions, “among the alike”, remind me very much the line from a poem of Kedrin Russian poet: “The poets have such a custom – when sitting in a circle, spit on each other”?

Let's try to understand.

First of all, as I see, those who, in a way or another, wanted to work in joint projects with Moldovan NGOs first time, “plant” colleagues can reveal about, softly saying, not the best experience. There are very few who had successful experience. Well, what shall we understand by experience? If we consider that working “under the umbrella” (when the main functions in any projects are fulfilled by Chisinau NGO, the Transnistrian NGO is given the role of “statistics keeper”, “working horse”, “our partner in Transnistria” - depending on the project's goals) – is a positive experience...

It is not a secret that in relations between NGOs there is an element of mistrust. Not always of course, but it is more an exemption from the rule, which, as commonly accepted, confirm the rule. The causes for mistrust are different. NGO sector is very narrow, many know each other, have experience in communication and work and, keeping all in mind, there appears, diplomatically saying, some mistrust.

Another not less important moment. Transnistria – it is a field for activity. At least this way it is sometimes presented. The expression “money are being given for our region, maybe we should work together” - sounds quite often. Well, let's work. But, usually, the one who gives the idea is the one who, in case of acceptance, manages the money. This fact does not encourage many to work.

There is also, not always said laudly, or often said as a joke, the supposition that every Transnistrian, who decided to fulfill himself in his field, a priori works, contacts (must be highlighted) with the Ministry of State Security. This is mental

constant of Moldovan NGO representatives, which not always encourages for a joint work with Transnistrian NGOs. But... Money are being given... Maybe it is worth trying?

All the above – not aimed at ridiculing or defaming anybody. These are the facts. Nobody says that there are no positive examples of cooperation which transform, unfortunately not too often, into friendship. There are such, but very and very few...

How will the relations between Moldovan and Transnistrian NGOs develop? Variants – great number, which depend on external factors, NGO internal situation, etc, etc, etc...

I will express my point of view. Probably, first of all, desire is needed. True desire to do something real, worth doing, touchable. Confidence is needed, confidence that what is being done – is really needed (to yourself, society, anybody else). Problems in joint work may be a hole lot, but, as I understand, if there is a common goal (which is not forgotten no matter unfavorable circumstances) and understanding, all the obstacles are possible to overcome.

And “then there is no understanding among colleagues...”

Success to all in joint projects!

PEACE AND SECURITY AT BLACK SEE. SITUATION IN MOLDOVA AND ROLE OF EUROPEAN UNION

During March 6th-9th 2007, in Brussels took place international conference on “Reestablishment of relations Black See area – what is the role of EU?”.

Among the numerous participants from Black See river side countries was also Mr. Petru Bondari, President of “Youth from Left Bank of Nistru river” Public Association and member of Youth Council by president of Dubasari raion.

About his impressions and conclusions Petru Bondari discussed with Violina Dolapci, press officer at “Youth from Left Bank of Nistru river” Association.

Here are some of these:

Mr. Petru Bondari what is the role of EU in Black See area?

Taking in consideration the fact that beginning with January 1st 2007, EU has direct

exit to Black Sea and is neighbor with countries from Black Sea area, the EU role and interest in this region intensified. One of the main reasons for increased interest of EU is the fact that the frozen conflicts in this region represent a field of instability at EU border. This interest was observed through European Neighborhood Policy in this region in which, one of the points is regulation of frozen conflicts.

How do the European officials see the solution of Transnistrian “equation”?

Exclusively through civilized means, i.e. diplomatic and peacefully. We met with many European parliamentarians, including heads of commissions for Black Sea and Republic of Moldova region. I noticed that their opinion is unanimous in regard to “Kosovo precedent”: a solution alike to Kosovo is not appropriate for Transnistrian conflict, as it is not valid for Chechnya, Osetya or Abkhazia. Personally, as inhabitant of Transnistrian region, I believe that it is as correct as possible approach because already the entire world knows the fact that in Moldova was and is no conflict between different groups of people, thus, this problem of the Republic of Moldova does not have connotations with those of Abkhazia, Osetya, Chechnya or Mountain Karabakh. Vice a versa, the population from both banks (except a limited group, which hold control in the region and has enormous profits) continues to hope for a future common state, in which their fundamental rights and freedoms will be respected.

What are the results of your visit?

I believe that the European officials understood one more time and from the first source that in the Transnistrian region of Moldova is no conflict among people and that Smirnov regime speaks from behalf of those whom he hold under total control. This is why there are being created all kinds of obstacles among our settlements, and the people are not being allowed to see each other at different meetings (even professional ones). For example – the specialists from the region can participate to professional meetings wherever but not with their colleagues from settlements under the jurisdiction of constitutional authorities.

HUMAN RIGHTS IN TRANSNISTRIA – WHERE ARE THESE?

In 20th century, the main document on human rights became “General declaration of human rights”, approved by UN General Assembly on December 10th 1948. Beginning with 1950, human rights Day is being celebrated on December 10th. Question arises: “What about human rights in Moldova?”. I believe that each one of us has a separate answer to this question, and we can discuss a lot in this regard, are the human rights in Moldova respected or not, if yes, then why the Republic of Moldova has over 45 cases lost at European Court for Human Rights.

My view is that, most of all, there are violated the rights of people who live in Transnistria. How much is it worth the commandant hour which is to be introduced in Bender for minors, or the most common facts of violation of rights – perception of a fee when entering the left bank territory, as well as the arrests of car owners for all kinds of invented reasons.

Not long ago I had the chance to participate to a seminar for representatives of different public organizations from Transnistrian regions on “Human Rights – general aspects”, organized by “Promo-Lex” Association. The most relevant is and will be the violation of human rights on the left bank of Moldova, as many ask themselves: “Are the customs posts and fees at the entrance to Transnistria legal?”, these are exactly the delicate issues in regard to which we should inform the inhabitants of left bank, tell them what to do in one or another situation, when human rights are violated.

I would like to emphasize that most of participants refused to give me any comments, even anonymously, or reveal the cases they went through. Differently would had behaved the inhabitants of Chisinau, Balti, Cahul, who are in better situation and full of determination to protect their rights. Only two out of all participants to the seminar decided to reveal their points of view:

Ghenadii Gherman, member of “Human rights protection fund”, president of “Integratia” public organization and “Inoe Mislenie” initiative group: “Of course, human rights are being violated since power is the natural source of violence. The question is to what extent the rights are violated and if the citizens can protect them in law bodies. Some of these rights, to some extent, can be protected and one can get a fair trial, in other cases it is practically impossible. I do not know how it is going to be in the future in Transnistrian region but of course I would like that protection of any rights be possible at state bodies. In regard to this seminar, it is stressed on educational aspect, so that the inhabitants of left bank be able to appeal to Moldovan authorities, feeling safe as later they might be persecuted”.

Alexander: “The main problem in regard to what happens on the left bank of Nistru river is that the authorities are not brought to account at all, equality of all in front of law is being violated. At the seminar I learned the process of appealing to international bodies, calling to account those who violate the law, and it is very important because people are not informed enough to protect their rights”.

It is being created the impression that the people who live in Transnistrian region belong to “nobody”, nobody needs them. How can we talk about respect of human rights when even Chisinau authorities cannot take care about the inhabitants from the left bank. In this case, this question is just appropriate: “Even so, where are the human rights in Transnistria?”. **I believe that we should not give up. Performance of such seminars and care of such kind from behalf of organizations that fight for human rights for colleagues from Transnistrian NGOs as well as for simple people from the right bank, proves one more time that the cooperation must continue.**

HUMAN RIGHTS IN TRANSNISTRIAN - REALITY

„Promo-lex” Legal Department

On March 13th 2007 at „Infotag” Agency hall, Promo-Lex Association organized a press conference on „serious and mass violations of fundamental rights and freedoms of people in Transnistrian region continues”.

In order to offer information to journalists and authorities from the first source, Promo-Lex Association invited, to this press conference some of numerous victims of the situation created in the region. Thus, 5 inhabitants from different settlements confessed, in front of journalists, concrete cases and situations, in which, the Transnistrian inhabitants are being seriously violated the fundamental constitutional rights.

Mihai Dirul, inhabitant of Lunga village, Dubasari raion revealed to journalists his case and situation up to date. In December 2006 his car was “arrested” by “Dubasari customs”, being obliged to go through “customs declarations” for “temporary import”. Explanation: M. Dirul is citizen of the Republic of Moldova, inhabitant of Transnistria region and owns a car registered by constitutional authorities of the Republic of Moldova.

Thus, in December 2006, M. Dirul appealed to constitutional authorities, OSCE, Russian Embassy in Chisinau and Promo-Lex Association towards respect and insurance of his constitutional rights. His problem was discussed within Unified Control Commission. Due to an interference, his car was released in January 2007, but local officials from Dubasari town warned him with arrest of his car in case he continues to circulate on “Transnistrian territory”. The constitutional authorities and bodies say that they cannot influence the regime from Tiraspol to respect the civilized norms and principles, cannot insure the inhabitants from Transnistrian region the respect of their fundamental rights and freedoms.

This way, until this situation is solved, Mr. Dirul is forced to keep his car at his relatives from the right bank of Nistru river and travel every day by bicycle to his car from his house and back, in order to freely travel on the rest of the country's territory.

Mr. Petru Casianu, citizen of the Republic of Moldova, inhabitant of Corjova village and owner of a car registered by constitutional authorities, after several years being forced to pay as “penalty” an enormous sum of approximately 1000 US dollars was paying regularly (once in 60 days) “temporary import fee”.

On February 28th 2007 another term expired. Every time, he was paying the fee at Dubasari “customs” and this day Mr. Casianu went to this “customs” also to pay

this “fee”, but the “customs officers” asked a bribe for being late. Since Casianu refused, there was decided to “arrest” the car. After 3 weeks, the car is still on the “customs” territory. Unfortunately neither involvement of lawyers nor appeal to president of Parliamentary Commission for Human Rights was able to make the “Transnistrian authorities” respect the rights of inhabitants from the Eastern region, especially of those of freedom of circulation and property of locals.

It must be mentioned the fact that in general the issue of car owners is an older one. For example, in the same connection, the participants to the press conference also revealed cases when the documents of region inhabitants, issued by constitutional authorities, were simply destroyed (especially the driving licenses). The victims are obliged to accept “Transnistrian citizenship” and receive all the documents at the bodies under illegal regime from Tiraspol. In this connection, it must be mentioned that fact that some of region inhabitants do not accept such documents because these are not recognized at international level, except certain CIS states, especially Ukraine and Russia. For example, both Petru Casianu and Mihail Dirul are drivers by profession and earn their living from transportation. It is clear that this situation creates them many problems and enormous prejudices. The participants mentioned the fact that the phenomenon negatively affects thousands of inhabitants of Transnistrian region but nobody is able to insure the respect of a minimum of their rights.

To the event also participated local authorities from Dubasari raion who proved that actually they are also victims of daily abuses from behalf of representatives of the regime from Tiraspol and cannot honor their official obligations towards citizens and inhabitants of Transnistrian region in regard to protection of their rights and freedoms.

Promo-Lex lawyers believe that all these situations happen because of non-respect of Moldovan-Russian Agreement from 1992 “regarding peaceful regulation of the situation from Transnistrian region of the Republic of Moldova “. Despite the fact that the parties (Russian Federation and Republic of Moldova) committed to insure free circulation of goods, services and persons, an at least bizarre situation was created: an international document is ignored by representatives of an illegal regime, and the signatories – subjects of international law do nothing but every time assist at violation of rights and freedoms of numerous persons in this area.

FREEDOM OF CIRCULATION AND HUMAN DIGNITY IN TRANSNISTRIA

My name is O.M., inhabitant of a state from European Union. It is for the second time that I am in Transnistria. Often I was watching the TV shows (very few) where I was seeing what was going on here, but never believed that the truth is worse.

Right when crossing the “Transnistrian customs” I was asked for invitation, which nobody asked when passed the customs of the Republic of Moldova and Romania. When I explained that I do not have an invitation and that nobody let me know in this regard, the “customs officers” from Tighina explained me that I will not be able to go further and that I have to return, or, another idea came to their mind... if I pay \$20 I could pass without an invitation. I had to reach for \$20 from my pocket and give them to let me go to Tiraspol. Once I gave them the money no any further explanations or checking the car were needed.

When I reached Tiraspol I had to go and pay the “registration” fee. The second day I left for Chisinau and again went through “Transnistrian customs”, where, this time, my checks and registration were taken away. I started to negotiate and behave diplomatically with the “customs officers”, as I am used to discuss with the people of law.

I explained them that only one day ago I made this registration and that with it I have the right to circulate freely for 30 days. I was shown an order from 2003 signed by Smirnov which, of course, I could not understand (it was given in Russian, which I do not understand). I asked them to show it in English but I was refused derisively. When returning to Tiraspol, the same day, I had to ask my host from Tiraspol to come to the “customs” with the invitation so that I do not pay american currency to enter the Eastern region of Moldova.

The invitation was nothing but simple bureaucracy (even a notary stamp was not applied on it). I was shocked by the general atmosphere and by the fact that the people from here execute with no questions any formalities so that nothing happens to them. The people from here are terrified and got used to this situation and mainly accept it.

In another regard I would like to plead upon quality of information revealed in means of mass media from this region.

In the evening of February 23rd (local administration continues to celebrate with lots of pomp “Soveit army day”), the hosts invited me to watch a 15 minutes show in “Moldovan” language, where I (re)heard (after about 17 years) the slogans of soviet/socialist propaganda. The chosen style amused me a lot and the aggressive tone of presenters terrified me at the same time.

On the street I was stopped by unknown persons when I decided to take some pictures in the center of Tiraspol town and I was asked to destroy the film. The hosts from Transnistria showed me the RDCT bulletin which seemed very relevant and useful and I ask you to also publish the opinions of foreigners about the real situation of human rights. In the zone, there is no warranty of respect of human rights. To be sincere, I was tensed during my stay in Transnistria and in my view, majority of people live there threatened because local “security services” control very well the situation. People say that their phone calls are being listened.

ANNOUNCEMENTS/FINANCING

Competition for a six months internship scholarship at European Parliament.

Young people aged between 18 and 28 from the Republic of Moldova are encouraged to apply for scholarship for a half a year internship at European Parliament or at an another European institution.

The competition is organized by Heinz Schwarzkopf Foundation from Berlin (Germany) in cooperation with European Youth Parliament, which offers annual prize „Young European of the year”. Eligible are young people the efforts of whom are especially dedicated to communication and European integration. The prize, of 5000 Euro, is offered for financing of a six months internship at the office of a deputy in European Parliament or within any other European institution. The prize may be also used for financing of a project in the field of European integration.

The forms that must be filled are available on: www.heinz-schwarzkopf-stiftung.de. The registration deadline is June 30th 2007.

Department for Youth Programs within the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports of the Republic of Moldova launched the small grants program for youth activities support. Within the program or youth activities support the priority to financed projects will be given to: development of associativity and stimulation of participation; facilitation to access to information and services; promotion of non-formal education; increase of employment chances for young people; promotion of healthy way of life; assessment of conformity of youth policies with youth needs.

The projects and appendixes should be presented in a sealed envelope to the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports address: Chisinau, Piața Marii Adunări Naționale 1 (RE: Small Grant Program). Deadlines for submitting the projects for different areas differ. The activities for each project should be planned to be started not earlier than one month from the deadline. Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports is NOT transferring the grant to the account of the winning organisation or the leader of the initiative group, but directly to the services render / economic agent.
